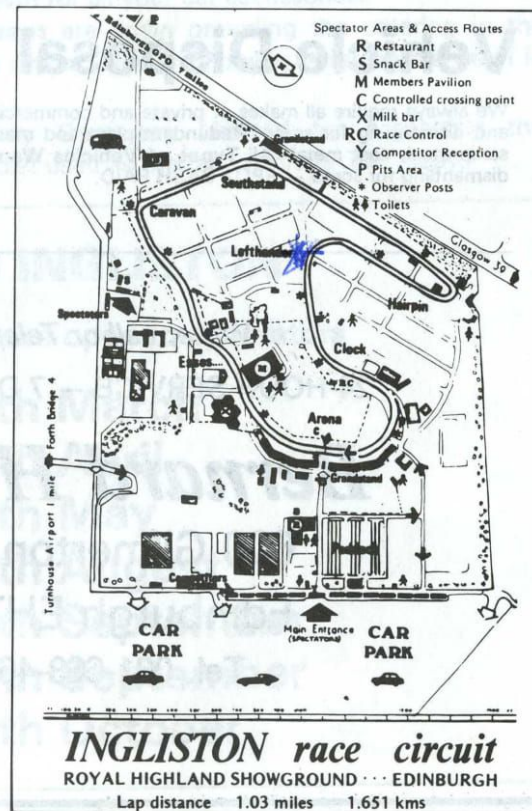

TODAY'S MEETING

Following two of our wettest race meetings on end we hope that the weather will be kinder to us today.

The Scottish Championships promoted by Ingliston Race Circuit Ltd., and organised by Scottish Motor Racing Club, are now reaching their climaxes with only two remaining rounds, today and 6th October at Ingliston.

The Hubert Mitchell Scottish Formula Ford 1600 Championship is being very closely fought by Cameron Binnie on 110 points, Willie Rose on 110 points and 1984 champion Tom Brown on 102 points, all of whom are racing today in the **Marlboro** sponsored FF1600 race. With scoring in this championship being 16 for a 1st place to 1 for a 16th place and the best 8 rounds out of 10 counting, the current leader, Cameron Binnie, could extend his score to 127, being only one point off the maximum available of 128 whilst Tom Brown, if he was to win at this and the next race meeting, could

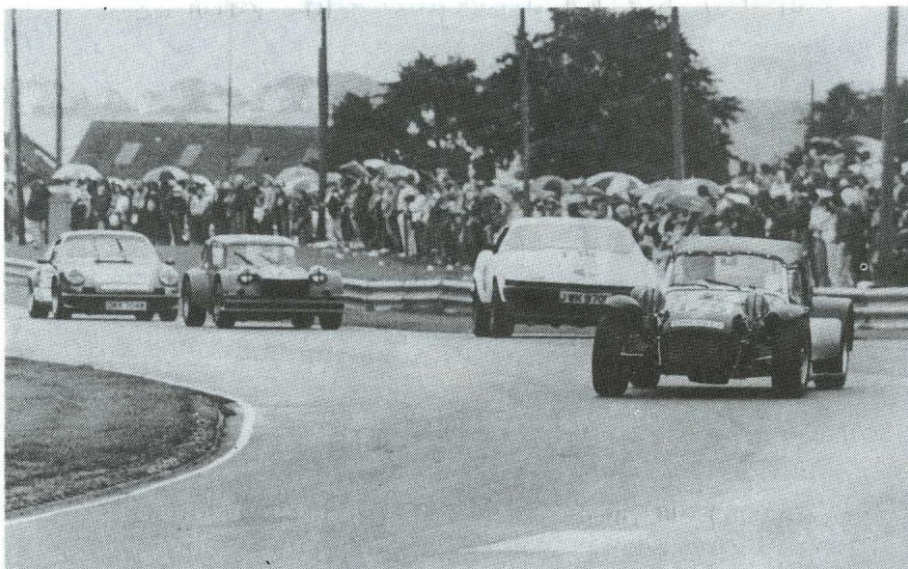

score 121 and Willie Rose has a maximum potential of 119, so all rests on these two meetings. The remaining places in this championship cannot be determined until a protest lodged at Knockhill on 1st September is decided and the results from 9th place down are settled. The other contenders in the Championship to watch out for are Andy Sim, Harvey Gillanders, Roy Low, Neil Cochrane and Geordie Taylor who are all fighting out the lower places but are unable to catch the three front runners.

A full grid of Road Saloon Cars up to 1600 c.c. including regular winner Olly Ross (Fiesta) with contenders for honours: John Irvine (Golf GTi), Jimmy Fleming (Toyota Celica) and Glen Mortimer (Avenger) should keep us all on our toes with close racing.

The Lowland Tyres & Exhausts Scottish Sports Car Championship is currently led by John Fyda with Kenny Allen in second place. These positions will not change due to this meeting as both of these drivers are

making their annual appearance at Zandvoort in Holland this weekend. With the usual race leaders not running it should be interesting to see who will come through from the mixed field to win today.

The Road Sports Car Race has now built up to a full grid and today looks like a good race between Ian Gardner, Tom McCallum, Robin Gray and a fast improving Allan McGregor but with so many cars in the field dicing should be taking place all the way down the grid.

The FF2000 class has been growing over the last season-and-a-half and we are now able to give it a race of its own today. We would like to see this class develop in the future so that next year it will be our principal single-seater formula championship. Thanks to **Bernard Hunter Crane Hire** there has been a championship this year with a good end of season prize fund, and today current championship leader Tom Brown, still unable to find a car for this class, will have to sit and watch and see if, in the **Robertson's Of Edinburgh** race Harry Minty can add to his score and come within striking

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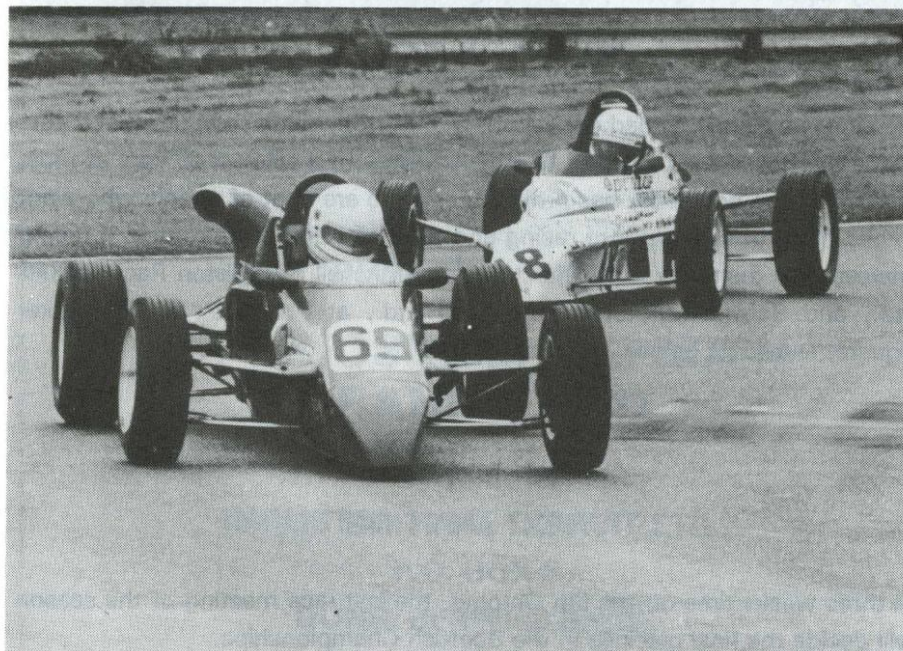
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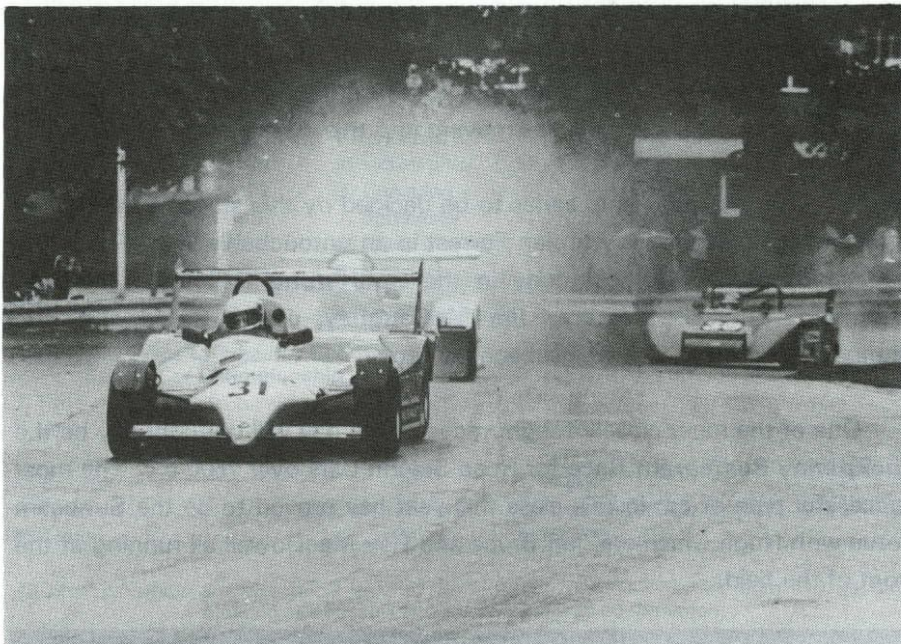

NEXT MEETING

In three weeks time on the 6th October, the last race meeting of the season will decide the final placings in the Scottish Championships.

As usual the meeting will feature an Historic Car Race.

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At each marshalling post round the circuit you will see various flags displayed. These are for the drivers' information and have the following meaning:

- (a) National flag or Red/Green lights: Start.
- (b) Blue flag — Stationary: Another competitor is following you close by.
- (c) Blue flag — Waved: Another competitor is trying to overtake you.
- (d) White flag: A service car or slow moving car is on the circuit.
- (e) Yellow flag — Stationary: Danger, no overtaking and slow down.
- (f) Yellow flag — Waved: Great danger, slow down, be prepared to stop, no overtaking.
- (g) Yellow flag with Red Stripes — Stationary: Slippery surface ahead.
- (h) Yellow flag with Red Stripes — Waved: Slippery surface imminent.
- (i) Green flag: Proceed, the hazard has been removed, or proceed on warming up lap.
- (j) Red flag: Immediately stop racing and proceed slowly and with maximum caution to pits or start line obeying marshal's instructions, and being prepared to stop should the track be blocked.
- (k) Black flag at individual marshals' posts: The race has been stopped.
- (l) Black flag with Orange disc displayed with White number: A warning of apparent mechanical failure or of a fire which might not be obvious to the driver. The car concerned **must** call at its pits on the next lap.
- (m) Black and White rectangular flag split diagonally and displayed with a White number: A warning to the driver of the car bearing the number that his behaviour is suspect and that he may be Black-flagged on further reports.
- (n) Black flag displayed with White number: The driver must stop at his pit within one lap of receiving the signal and report to the Clerk of the Course. A penalty of exclusion may be enforced by removing a car from the race by display of the Black flag.
- (o) Black and White chequered flag: End of Race or Finish.

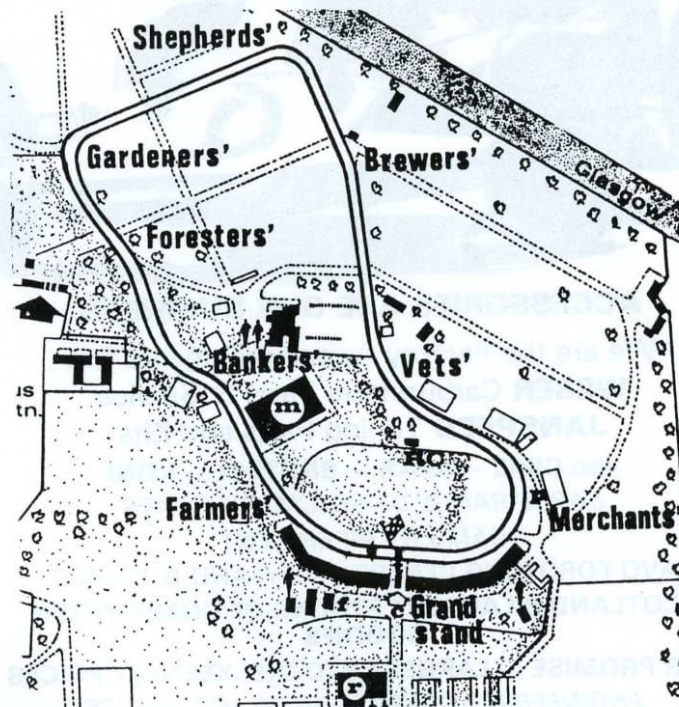

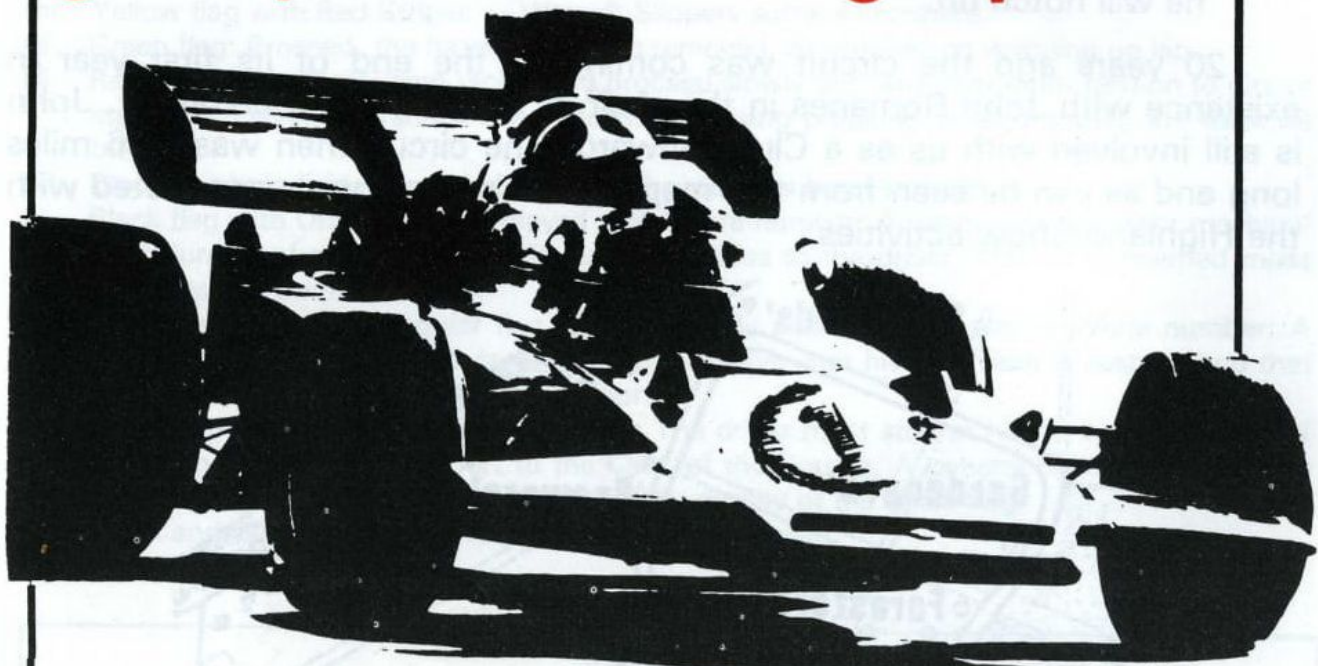
