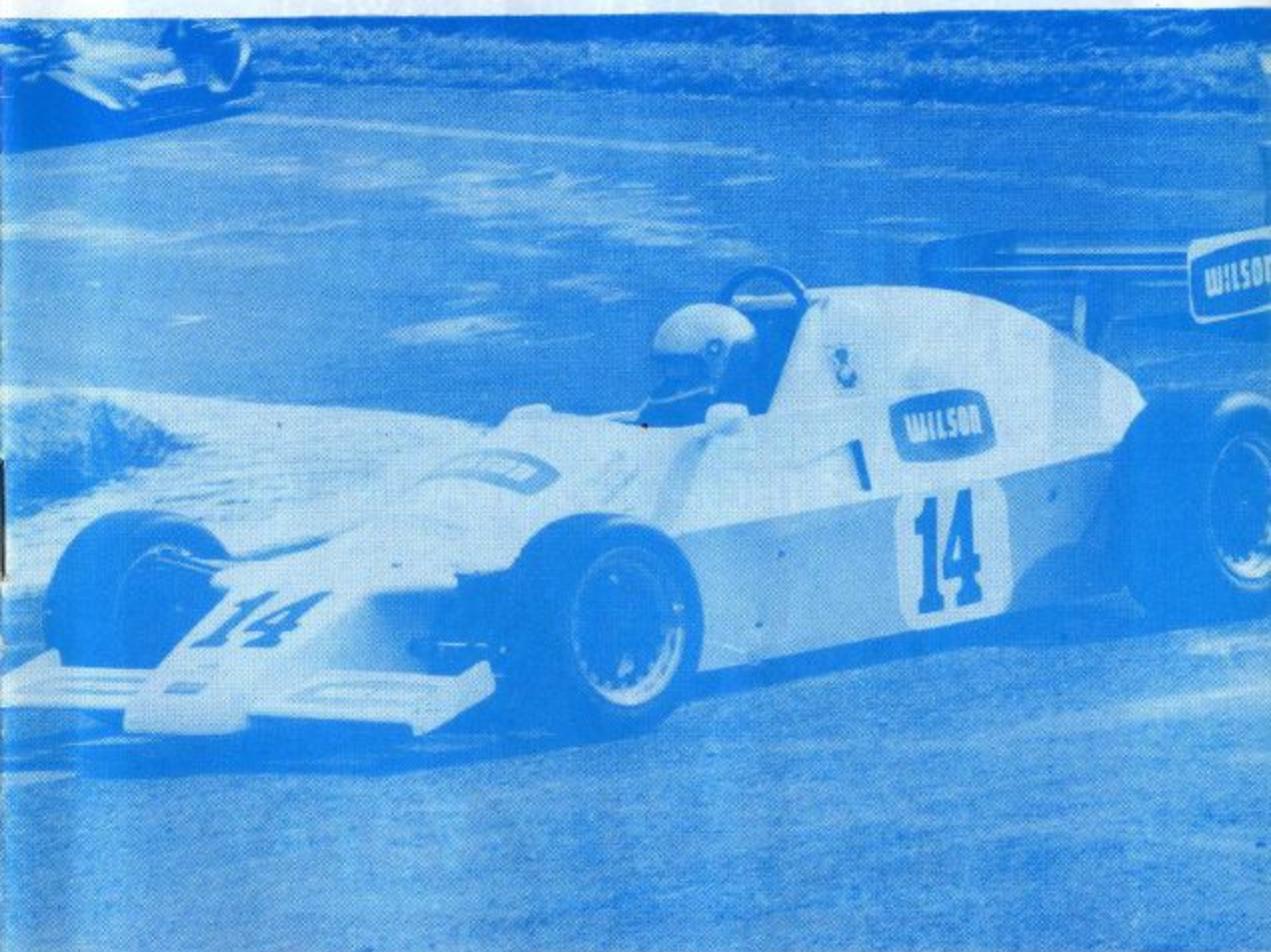

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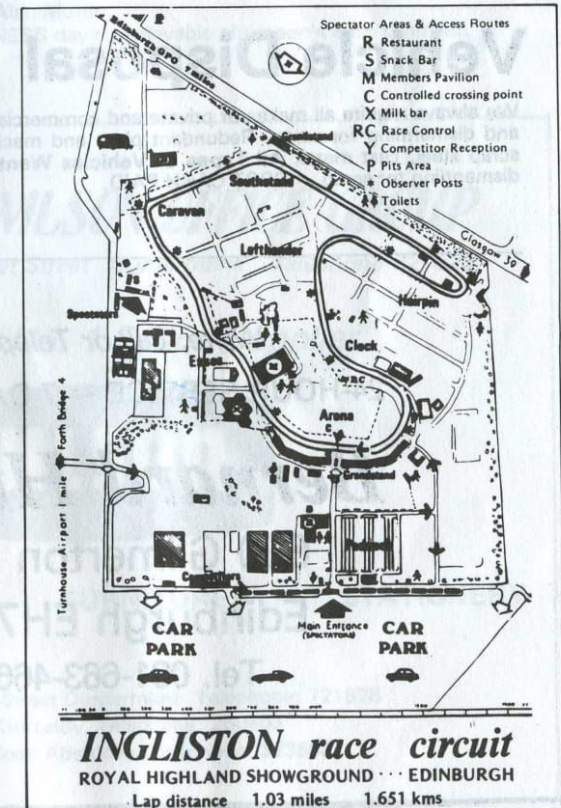

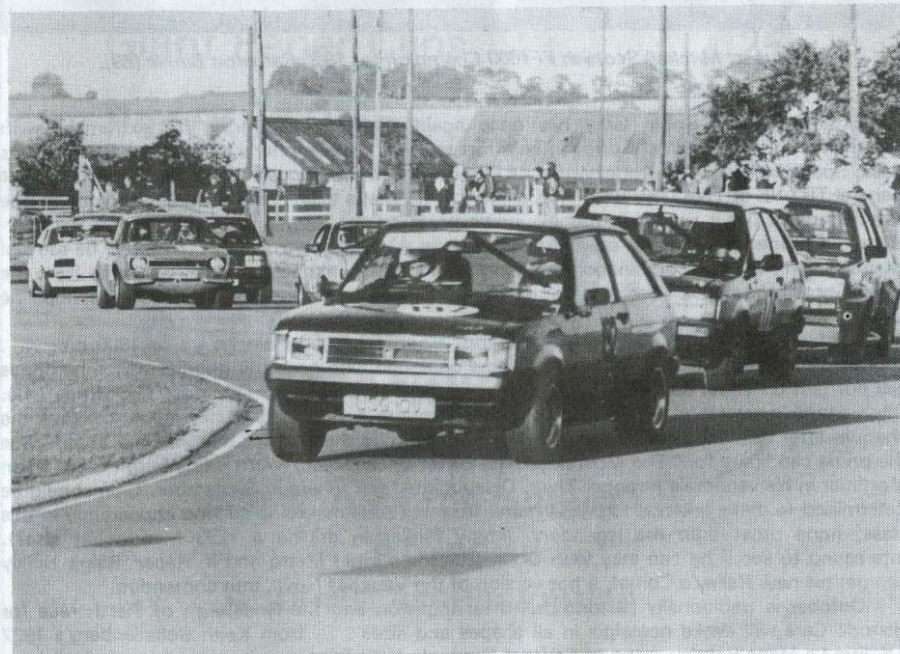

TODAY'S MEETING

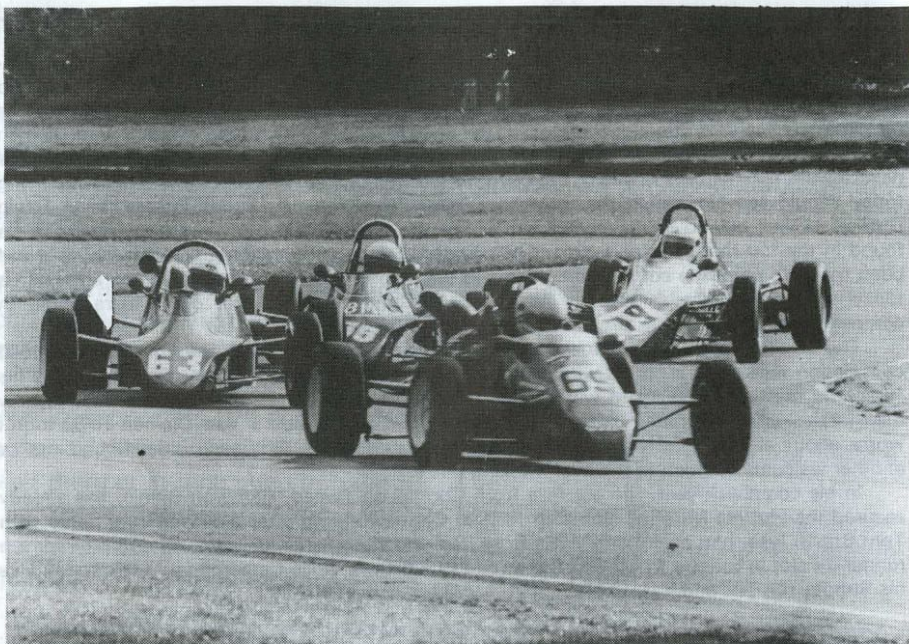
The final gathering of the season here at Scotland's Motorsport Mecca is the **James Wilson U-BiX** race meeting sponsored by the James Wilson Office Group, whose eponymous chief is no mean pilot of a Formula Ford 2000. James, however, will be vacating the driving seat today as his company is also putting up the loot for the FF2000 race in which Alan Mutter's Van Diemen will fly the corporate banner. Tom Brown, without a suitable car for the last few meetings, has nevertheless maintained his lead in the **Bernard Hunter Crane Hire** series and a decent placing today should see him clinch the Scottish FF2000 Championship. Ecurie Ecosse driver David Duffield is well behind in the points battle, but the blue Mondial is nowadays usually to be found in the top three so don't expect him to give Brown an easy time. Diplomatic David has been trying to persuade some leading lights in the Irish FF2000 contingent to come and join us today and, if he talks as well as he drives, the grid could contain some extra talent in competitive machinery.

The smaller Ford-engined races kick off the meeting as usual with the Formula Ford 1600 consolation race. Last month's winner Kenny Brown will have had a busy time rebuilding his PRS after the first lap accident which took him and Mike MacPherson out of the final. A new man in this class is Dunfermline's Fraser Greenwood who fields a Van Diemen RF82 (don't worry about all these FF1600 type numbers, I can't tell the difference either!) and makes another welcome addition to the ever-swelling ranks.

In his comeback year, the big fella from Cornhill-on-Tweed, Cameron Binnie, has already secured the **Hubert Mitchell Scottish FF1600 Championship** after a season-long battle with Tom Brown (yes, him again) and Willie Rose. So, the aforementioned duo will do battle for the runner-up slot in today's **Marlboro Race for FF1600 Cars** while Cameron sits back and enjoys his Sunday run . . . and if you believe that, you'll swallow anything!

Expatriate Scot Robin Gray has once again threatened to bring his extremely swift Caterham 7 up from darkest Surrey in an effort to break Iain Gardner's hold on the Road Sports class. Sponsored today by **Robertson's of Edinburgh**, the race could go to the thunderous Data General TR7 V8 of Tam 'The Bam' McCallum . . . he keeps telling me he's going to win, so one day he's gotta get it right. My money, however, is on the Ziggi's Lotus Seven and the ever-cheerful Gardner whose press-on-regardless style is always a joy to behold. This may be the last chance to witness this combination in action as Iain has intimated that he might retire from the Road Sports class next year to give the rest of the entry a shot at the gold . . . I hope he reconsiders.

Gardner will be out again in the **Peugeot Race** for Road Saloons up to 1600 c.c. . . . appropriately driving his Peugeot 205 GTi now equipped with go-faster goodies which he hopes will put him on equal terms with the all-conquering Fiesta XR2s of Olly Ross and Bruce Lyle. Olly's example scratched with a didgy clutch last month and Bruce's hastily rebuilt car took the chequer after snatching the lead on the last lap. Fronting the field for the previous 11 laps was the prime candidate for "The Most Improved Driver of the Year Award", Edinburgh cabby Glen Mortimer in his venerable Avenger Tiger. Disappointed not to win in September, Glen should be determined to make amends today. A name from the past makes its second appearance in this class, none other than the legendary Jimmy Pinkerton driving a 1293 Mini (what else?). Interesting to see if he can stay with Doug Dawson's rapid Metro and if 'Racer' Ralph Halley can get his new Halley's Comet, a hot version of the Vauxhall Nova, into contention.

October is traditionally Historic month at Ingliston and the **Rossleigh of Perth** race for Historic Cars will evoke nostalgia in all shapes and sizes . . . from Keith Schellenberg's 1927 4 1/2-litre Le Mans Bentley down to Stewart Gordon's 1932 Trice, a unique machine derived from a Morgan three-wheeler which looks and sounds like two speedway bikes welded together. In between Exosse boss Hugh McCaig enters his Jaguar XK140, while Campbell McLaren gives

the earlier XK120 a run. John Fyda (the same one) has a 3½-litre Bentley and Roddy McPherson makes a welcome return in the 1953 Cooper Bristol. Charlie Munro, last year's winner, returns in his (relatively) modern Vixen-Imp but will only be racing for fun, leaving the loot and the glory for fastest of true Historics.

Meeting sponsors **The James Wilson Office Group** are in action again for the **U-Bix** race for Clubman and Libre cars. Back for this final round of the **Lowland Tyres & Exhausts** Scottish Sports Car Championship should be series leader John Fyda, after conquering Europe at Zandvoort last month. Kenny Allen's Dutch trip was less fruitful, a blown engine the only memento of the meeting, but the Lowland Tyres Vision is now back together and fit to fight. Eric Paterson let team-mate Frank Lethbridge do the winning whilst he was in Holland, but the Edinburgh veteran is back to show Frank who's boss and the Mallock 27, now beginning to benefit from a season's development work, should be well on the pace. The U-Bix race is also the final round of the Scottish Libre series and since Fyda and Allen head that chart as well, I won't bother to repeat myself, except that FF2000 runners are invited to join in the fun.

The final round of the Scottish GT series is of academic interest only to Ian Forrest, he pocketed the title ages ago. However, the Drambuie Imp is bound to feature strongly in the one-litre class with main opposition coming from Eric Munnoch and Ricky Gauld in the slipper little Davrians. The bigger bangers in this **Sportstune Race** should once again be dominated by Jim McGaughay's wondrous Lancia-Toleman, already the *Motoring News* Transnational GT Champion. Ron Cummings' Esprit and Bill Paul's AC 3000ME will put up a fight but they'll all be watching for Ray Mallock who, finding some fuel left in the tanks of the Ecurie Ecosse C2 after its victorious Brands Hatch 1000, decided to run here today so the gas wouldn't go to waste. Ray won't be after the awards, since the Ecosse isn't strictly a GT car, but it's another opportunity to see this beautiful car in the kind of action that shook up the World Endurance Championship.
