


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

We are fortunate here at Ingliston having Lewis Jamieson as our chief timekeeper as he is one of the best handicappers in the business and it will be interesting to see how he gets on today with such a motley collection of cars including Brian Hopkins' $4\frac{1}{2}$ -litre Bentley and Sir Aubrey Brocklebank's Morgan.

Ingliston circuit promoter and Patron of Ecurie Ecosse, Hugh McCaig, returns to racing at this Exchange & Mart Ingliston race meeting when he will run his Ecurie Ecosse Tojeiro-Buick in the historic race. The Tojeiro-Buick was unique at the time in using the American aluminium Buick engine and shortly afterwards the team sold the original racing engine to the Rover Motor Company from which they based the present V8 engine used by Rover in their road cars.



many cars in the paddock covering the Classic and Vintage scene and we hope that this idea of bringing the two events together is a great success.

Back to today's meeting, Dundee driver John Fyda has his Vision Clubman's car rebuilt after it caught fire during testing before the last meeting but he will have a hard job to catch up on Troon's Andy Smith (Mallock) who is leading the Lowland Tyres & Accessories Clubmans and Sports Car Championship with his B Class car. Watch out for Allen Johns with his Mallock who was in good form at the last meeting and Eric Paterson (Vision) will want to make up for retiring in August.

In the road saloon car class Alaster Cunningham with his Manta appeared to have a good chance for an outright win as his close rival, Tom Bell (Sierra Cosworth) had not sent in his entry by closing date but the entry duly came in and so we are again going to see a good battle in this class. The relatively unknown Giancarlo Pia with his Hycalog Drilling Toyota Corolla showed up well in August before going off and he could be worth watching.

In the small car class there will be the usual Fiesta battle with Alan Keith, Ray MacDowall, Glen Mortimer and Jonathan Gilbert; Mortimer having had to repair an engine since August.

In the FF2000 class, Harvey Gillanders from Aberdeen in his Claymore Shellfish Swift could possibly clinch the Silverscreen FF2000 Championship at this meeting if he wins the race against his great rival Stewart Roden with his ANC Reynard but at each meeting Roden has been getting back into the swing after some problems with engines and he could well

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

turn the tables. The dark horse all season has been Robert Thomson from Edinburgh with a Reynard and he could be due a win which would really put the cat amongst the pigeons.

The other tough class is the road sports car class where the Duttons are up against the Westfields. John Peace with his Ginetta may be a late entry but as a farmer he may have to be working today. Raddy Sarafilovic is due for a break this season as his Westfield has given him a bit of trouble but Keith Scott in his Rover-engined Dutton looks good.

The sad thing about the GT race is that Ron Cummings' superb Simpson Motors/Claymore Shellfish Lotus Esprit is so quick that nobody ever has much of a look in. The real action will be in the 1000cc class as usual where lan Forrest with his Drambuie Imp, Brian Fletcher with his Davrian and Kenny Coleman with his Esprit are likely to wage their usual war of attrition. Forrest needs a bit of luck but Coleman is still the favourite.

The Formula Ford 1600 competitors had a shock at the last meeting when the scrutineers sealed the leaders' engines but it didn't make any difference and Cameron Binnie is likely to take the honours if he can get his usual good start against Colin Harper who has been the revelation of the season. Ewen Buchan's Arctic Coldstore Construction Reynard is likely to be in the first five as is Colin Birkbeck from Penrith with his Van Diemen but Colin has had an unlucky season so far.

By the time this meeting is over and with just two meetings to go at Ingliston this season (September 25 and October 16) we are likely to see how the Championships will look.

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


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
