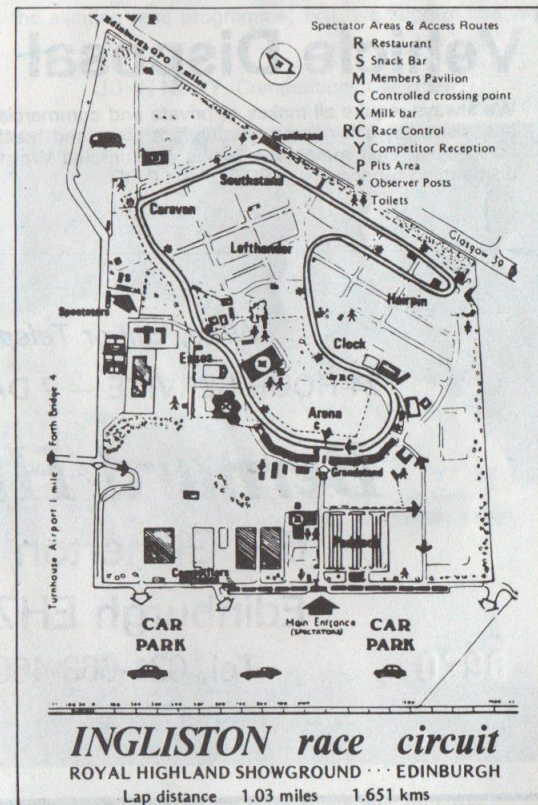

However, we have not moved too far from our 'traditional' mix of displays, parades and lunch-time entertainment which have proved so entertaining in the past.

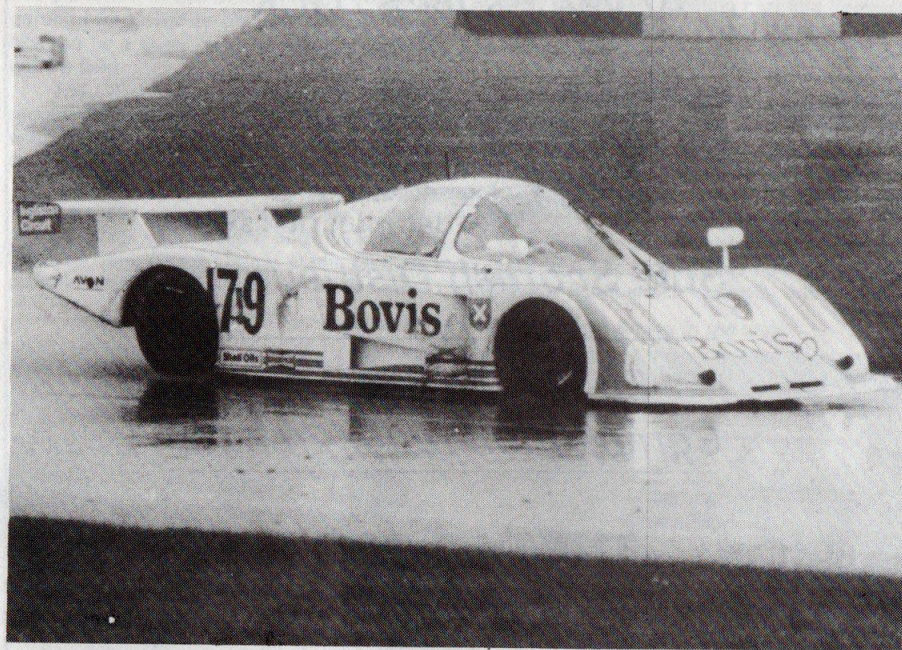

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TODAY'S MEETING

The Scottish G.M. Dealers' Trophy race meeting here at Ingliston is always something special, for in addition to the racing there is plenty of other entertainment. There are, for instance, these skillful Autotest drivers who show you what you can do with practice and just a normal motor car and then there is an innovation with the Dog Handling team in action.

This is over and above the normal race programme which looks like being something special. Two years ago Ingliston was getting fairly small entries for the meetings but thanks in particular to the Road Car classes being formed entries are now bulging at the seams and so everyone today is likely to find some form of racing to their fancy.

This season has also seen a lot of new faces not only coming into the sport but getting up to the front. Who would have thought that after his domination of the Hubert Mitchell Formula Ford Championship in the past that Tom Brown would have such a tough task this year; but it has happened and at the July meeting we had the spectacle of a brilliant drive by Willie Rose from Fyvie with is Reynard who dominated the race and kept a cool head in the streaming wet conditions to hold off Cameron Binnie. Binnie is having his second breath in Formula Ford as he was one of the leading competitors in the late 1970s but retired from the sport only to come back and add a lot of bite to this class of racing. Watch out too for young Andy Sim from Larkhall the ex-kart driver who spent a few years working with Reynard, the racing car manufacturers and has returned to work in Scotland and compete in the Scottish Championship with, of course, his Reynard. Then there are the Gillanders Brothers from Murcar with their Van Diemens supported by Cameron Industrial Services. Roy Low from Linlithgow is also having a new lease of life this year despite the fact that he is driving an older car than his competitors.

In the Clubmans/Sports Car race the sheer domination of Kenny Allen and John Fyda this season has seen some tremendous battles between them and Allen, despite engine trouble earlier in the season, is now challenging Fyda's normal hold on this Championship. If you add to this the return of Les Duncan who damaged his car badly at the May meeting plus Eric Paterson getting more used to his new Mallock Mk 27 and Hertfordshire driver Tony Pouyanne this is likely to be a good race. Add to this Laurence Jacobsen's beautiful Chevron B16 and we have quite a field.

The same is true for the Road Saloon Car class up to 1600 c.c. where all eyes will be on regular GM driver Andrew Jeffrey with his Nova Sport and the return to racing of Ralph Halley with another Nova and the regulars in this class will have a tough time. The men to beat are Olly Ross and Bruce Lyle with their Fiestas and Iain Gardner's Peugeot 205 GTi.

The GT Race is likely to see another confrontation between Jim McGaughay with his Toleman-Lancia and Ron Cumming's Claymore Shellfish Esprit. Cumming, in particular, has proved to be more reliable and quick this season than before and he finished second to the Ecurie Ecosse Group C2 car at the last Ingliston meeting albeit McGaughay had a plug lead come loose. The car to look out for is Kenny Coghill's new Esprit which has body design. It ran

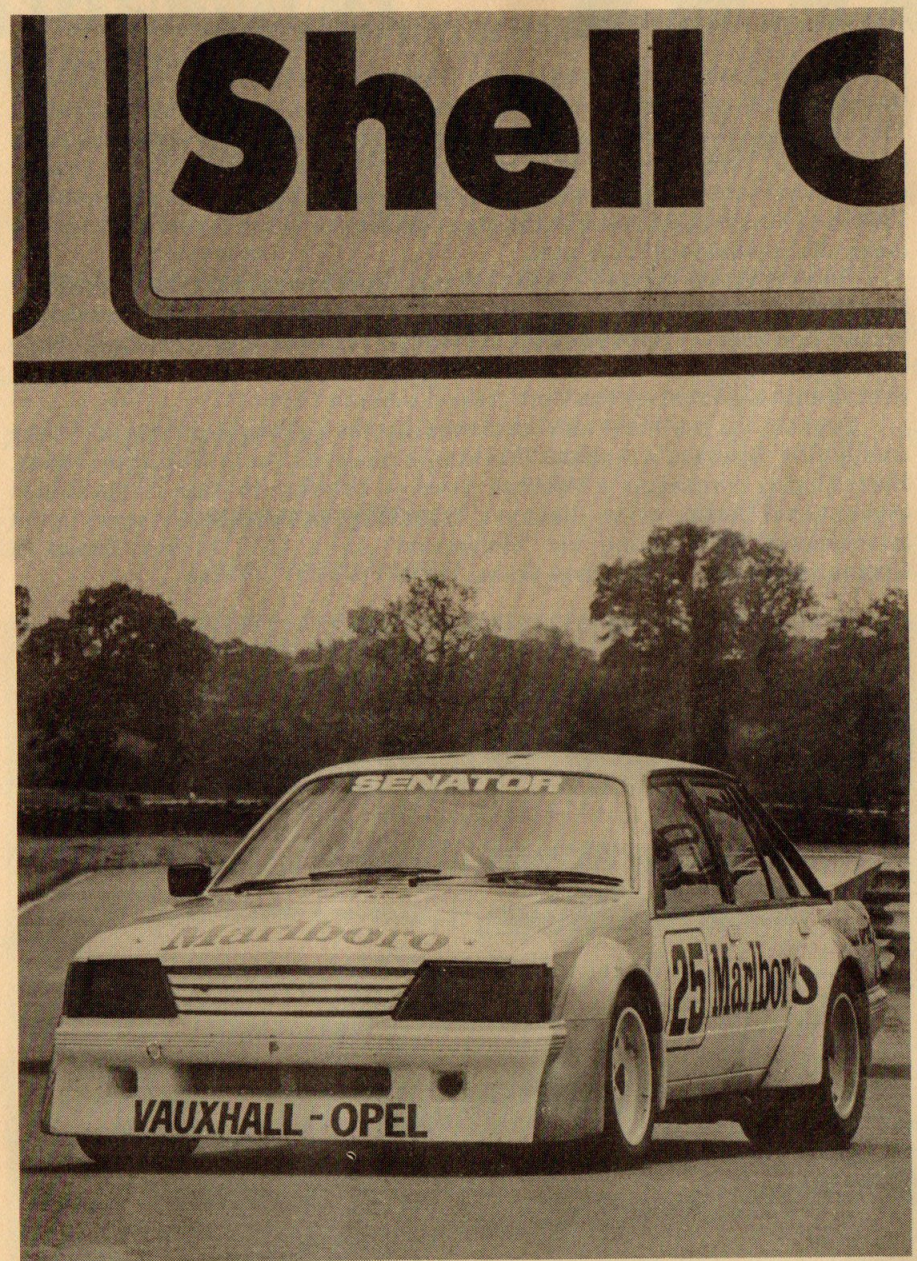

GM DEALER SPORT IN ACTION

GM Dealer Sport was formed at the beginning of 1982 to promote sales of Vauxhall-Opel cars through a wide range of British motor sport activities. The successful activities range from direct funding of cars, support packages to privately entered drivers plus the organisation of two popular one marque championships: the AC Delco Astra Challenge for modified 1300 c.c. Vauxhall Astras and the Vauxhall Rental Nova Junior Cup for the under-25s in standard 1.2 Novas.

Rallying is the domain of the 275 h.p. Opel Manta 400s, ably driven by Scotland's Jimmy McRae, the reigning British Champion, and Worcester's Russell Brookes — currently joint leaders of the Shell Oils RAC Open Rally Championship and poised to provide a battle royale on the final round. A third Manta is piloted by Northern Ireland's Bertie Fisher.

Backing up the main rally challenge comes a fleet of production class cars led by Scotland's Andrew Wood in a Vauxhall Astra GTE. For Wales, Harry Hockly campaigns a Vauxhall Nova — heading its class in the British International Series, whilst Clacton's Brian Wiggins has already sewn up an international title, taking his 'showroom' Astra GTE to the Group N Championship win in the Open Series.

On the National scene, Stuart Nichols from Walsall is dominating the production class in his Astra GTE, while Graham Parkinson is performing a giant killing act in the Nova and pressing Nichols for points.

But today is for racing, and that's the sport for the six car GM Dealer Sport team. Led by the big Opel Monzas of John Cleland and Tony Lanfranchi, the 180 h.p. flagships are pushing for outright victory in the larger class races. Next come the Astras and Novas in the smaller car classes. Led by John Llewellyn in the Snetterton 24-hour race class winning Astra GTE and joined by Terry Nightingale's similar car. James Kaye and Andrew Jeffrey are the little car challengers in a pair of Novas — dominating their class this season.

Guaranteed to entertain this afternoon are the AC Delco Astra Challengers, sampling the second track event of this predominantly rallying series. Many of the young drivers will have made their race debut at Brands Hatch last month and the action is sure to be fast and furious.

Newcomer to the team is the Thundersaloons Vauxhall Senator. 450 h.p., soon to terrorise the British race tracks with 'guest' appearances, but destined to fly the GM Dealer Sport flag in next year's Thundersaloons championship.

ASTRA RACE IN SCOTLAND

Favourite for victory is David Beesley, winner of the first race, held at Brands Hatch in July. The Leicestershire nurseryman, sponsored by Forest Road Garage of Coalville, drove a sensible race, capitalising on others' misfortunes with a fast, polished performance.

Out to avenge their defeat will be runner-up at Brands Hatch Brian Furner and series leader Tony Saddington.

Along with Beesley, these two drivers showed the greatest turn of speed but other drivers to watch include Steve Bamber, Chris Atkinson and Kim Kirk.

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for the first time last meeting and was not handling properly but it has great potential in this class.

In the Road Sports Car Class there are the usual collection of Dutton kit cars with Brian Hill's car astonishingly quick. All eyes, however, must be on Iain Gardner again with his Ziggy's Lotus Caterham Seven as Gardner is having an inspired season and drove brilliantly at the last meeting in the wet. If it is wet Raymond Stewart's Clan should be up there with him as will John Mackie with his Lotus Elan.

Formula Libre racing has been dominated this year by the Clubmans cars but there are one or two single seaters taking part including Derry Houston with his Chevron. With Allen and Fyda in such devastating form, however, even the single seaters will have a tough time. The race within this race will come from the Formula Ford 2000s and we again have a good entry of these cars and promise that there will be even more before the season ends and more next year. This is likely to take over as the premier single seater class at Ingliston.

Tom Brown, who has dominated the series so far in Steve Buxton's Van Diemen might well be sitting on the sidelines as the car has been sold to John Wilson. Another newcomer to the class is Alan Mutter who had his first run at the last meeting. Campbell Chisholm from Fort William could have a good race here and Harry Minty's Van Diemen RF83 could also be in contention but the two men to watch in the class are the August meeting winner David Duffield in the Ecurie Ecosse Mondiale and Stephen Robertson with his Reynard. Robertson has missed the last two meetings at Ingliston due to racing down south and he scored a great victory in the British Championships at Donington and was lying in second place in those Championships. It will be interesting to see how he fares back at Ingliston after his southern experiences.

The main Road Saloon car class is the Luckpenny Restaurant race and here the big guns are out in force. For the most successful driver, Hugh Chalmers with his Sunbeam Lotus, the July meeting was a disaster as he spun and damaged his fuel tank. This meant that Ecurie Ecosse took another win with David Leslie in the Vauxhall Chevette. Today GM Dealersport and Shell supported British Rally Champion Jimmy McRae will be back at the wheel and with the backing of Allan Smith the brilliant ex-kart driver they will be out to win with their Chevettas at this GM meeting. George McMillan who used to compete with his Ralt in the Libre events might be a late starter with John Clark's BMW but he will have his work cut out to beat the leading competitors in this class.

Then there is that very special race for Vauxhall Astra Sports. Last year only a handful turned up at the circuit but this year we have a maximum grid of 20 down to practice with the fastest 16 racing. This should be a very interesting race bearing in mind it will be the third different production-based Championship race to be seen at Ingliston this season. Many of the competitors are rally drivers and are not used to the circuit, so this too should add to the day.

We hope that you will join with our sponsors, the Scottish GM Dealers, in having a good day at Ingliston and look forward to seeing you at the next meeting in September.

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- (a) National flag or Red/Green lights: Start.
- (b) Blue flag — Stationary: Another competitor is following you close by.
- (c) Blue flag — Waved: Another competitor is trying to overtake you.
- (d) White flag: A service car or slow moving car is on the circuit.
- (e) Yellow flag — Stationary: Danger, no overtaking and slow down.
- (f) Yellow flag — Waved: Great danger, slow down, be prepared to stop, no overtaking.
- (g) Yellow flag with Red Stripes — Stationary: Slippery surface ahead.
- (h) Yellow flag with Red Stripes — Waved: Slippery surface imminent.
- (i) Green flag: Proceed, the hazard has been removed, or proceed on warming up lap.
- (j) Red flag: Immediately stop racing and proceed slowly and with maximum caution to pits or start line obeying marshal's instructions, and being prepared to stop should the track be blocked.
- (k) Black flag at individual marshals' posts: The race has been stopped.
- (l) Black flag with Orange disc displayed with White number: A warning of apparent mechanical failure or of a fire which might not be obvious to the driver. The car concerned **must** call at its pits on the next lap.
- (m) Black and White rectangular flag split diagonally and displayed with a White number: A warning to the driver of the car bearing the number that his behaviour is suspect and that he may be Black-flagged on further reports.
- (n) Black flag displayed with White number: The driver must stop at his pit within one lap of receiving the signal and report to the Clerk of the Course. A penalty of exclusion may be enforced by removing a car from the race by display of the Black flag.
- (o) Black and White chequered flag: End of Race or Finish.

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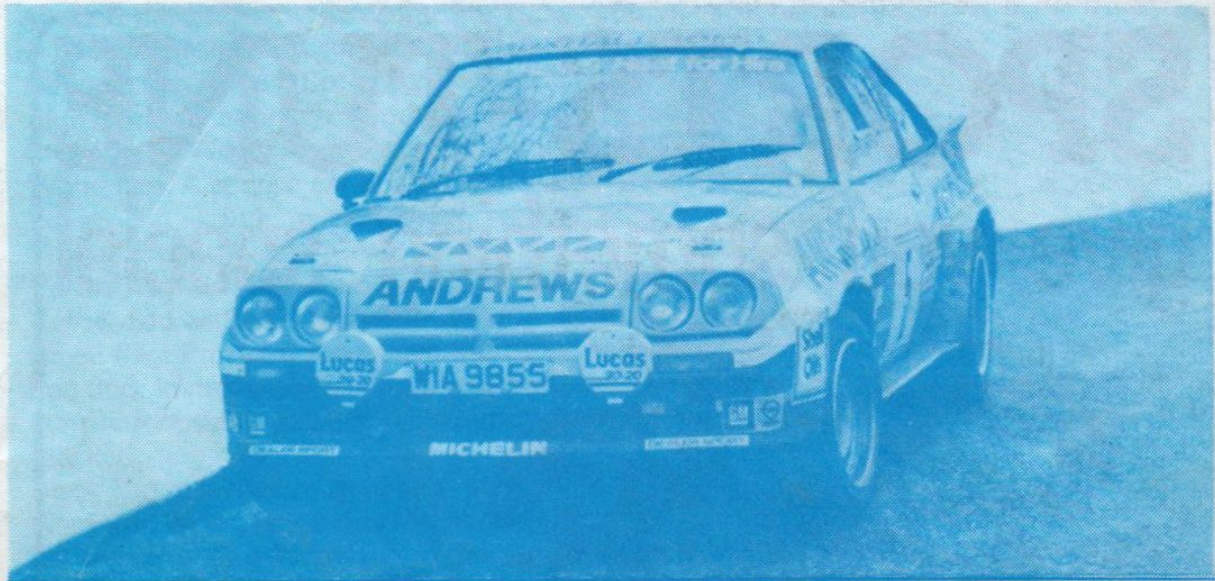
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
